

Building Felt!

Lesson Idea:

Romans 8:28

28 And we know that God causes everything to work together^[a] for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them.

This game helps children see that although they can only feel and experience their part when things are all put together there is an outcome they didn't see coming.

Cut out a character from a theme you are doing or a character from the Bible using a large piece of felt, it can be as easy as a snowman or as complicated as Goliath.

Items needed:

- Felt cut outs of the character you are building
- Blind folds

Game instructions:

1. Every team member must be blindfolded at **all** times.
2. Each person is handed a piece of felt and without peeking they try and guess what part they are holding.
3. The team then works together to build their character.
4. Encourage them to talk and they may ask you questions but no peeking until the game leader says they may remove their blindfold.
5. The leader can return pieces to players if they are in the wrong place.
6. If children are struggling, adapt the game to now allow them to take off their blindfolds and build it together. You can then adjust the message to say how when we discover who Jesus is and what He has done for us, it is like changing from being blind to being able to see

(John 9:25) Seeing Jesus for who He is makes it so much easier to love Him and live a life that pleases Him.
