Field agents need to stay alert, strong and ready for any new mission that comes their way.


To be the best agent you can be, it is important to keep in contact with "Headquarters" – God!.


(Luke 19:1-10) Zacchaeus was a tax collector and he had become very rich taking more money than he should have.



When Jesus came to his town, Zacchaeus was too short to see Jesus and so he climbed up into a tree to have a look.




When Jesus walked by, He called Zacchaeus by name and told him He was coming to his house for a meal.




The stranger on the beach was actually Jesus!

Jesus took some time to talk to Peter. Jesus asked Peter again and again if he loved Him. And each time Peter answered "Yes, Lord, you know I love you!" Jesus told Peter each time that He wanted Peter to feed and take care of His sheep. That



meant that Jesus still wanted Peter to take care of God's people and tell them about Jesus EVEN THOUGH PETER HAD MESSED UP!

Did you know that Peter wasn't the only disciple who messed up?




Have you ever messed up? How did it make you feel?

The Early Church met in different places and did many things together:



They listened to the <u>Apostle's</u> <u>teachings</u> about Jesus.

They <u>shared meals</u> together including the "Lord's Supper" which we do to remember what Jesus did for us on the cross.





They kept their minds and hearts focused on Jesus by **praying** together.


The believers <u>shared everything</u> they had with those who were in need. Some even sold their belongings and gave the money to help other believers.




They would also meet at the temple and **worship** together.



The church today, that's us, **still does these things**. We have been called to live in community, keeping Jesus at the center and do what He has called us to do.

At the last meal Jesus ate with His disciples before He was killed, Jesus said thanks to God, took some bread and broke it in pieces.

Jesus said to His disciples, "This is my body given for you. Do this to remember me and what I have done for you."



Breaking bread is to remind us that Jesus suffered and died so we could be forgiven for our sins.

Jesus then took a cup of red wine and gave thanks for it. Then He said, "This is my

blood, poured out for many, sealing the new agreement between God and man."



Then He passed the cup around the disciples for them all to drink a little.

In your group, give thanks and pass the cup of grape juice around for each person to have a sip.

The red wine is a reminder of the blood Jesus shed on the cross to pay the price of our forgiveness. It's a symbol of the new promise God has made with His people.







(Acts 3:1-10) Peter and John were two of Jesus' disciples. They had been filled with the Holy Spirit, just like Jesus had promised would happen to all who believed in Him.

When they went to the temple to pray a lame man asked them for some money.




(Numbers 13-14) God told Moses to choose 12 leaders, a leader from each tribe of Israel, to spy out the Promised Land of Canaan.

The 12 men set off and after 40 days the men returned and told them what they saw.






The land of Canaan flowed with 'milk & honey' and the men showed the Israelite people the grapes they had brought back.



One grape bunch was so big they had to put it on a pole and carry it between 2 men! They also brought some of the pomegranates and figs back.





The spies also told the Israelite people the cities were very large and protected. The people of Canaan were tall like giants and the Israelites are like tiny grasshoppers!

started to grumble and complain to Moses.


Only Joshua and Caleb remembered what God had done for them already. They BELIEVED God would give them the land He had promised. They were the only ones that had FAITH in God



Choose a verse you have read, write it on the Bible below and then learn it off by heart:



Draw prison bars over Paul and Silas.


In the middle of the night everyone in the prison could hear singing. It was Paul and Silas! Even in prison they were singing to ______ God how much they loved Him.

But Paul and Silas had chosen to not run away but stay and ______ the man about Jesus. They even went to ______ his family about Jesus too.




The guard and his family all believed in Jesus and were baptised straight away.

So the widow made bread for all of them and the next day when she looked in her containers there **was more oil and flour for the day**.





The next day the same thing happened. Everyday there was enough oil and flour because **God provided**.





Look up John 5:15 and write who the man said healed him.


This time the people **did not** believe in Jesus. Do you think it is important to still tell others what Jesus has done?


