




The variations for this craft are endless. Children love to follow along in the lesson or even read it to their families and friends when they get home.







Items needed per child:

- Printed template of the Mini Story Book
- Scissors

Craft making instructions:

	<p>1) Fold the paper in half widthways.</p> <p><i>If you are using one of the pre-printed templates, keep the print on the outside to make the folding easier later. The grey in the illustration is showing the wrong side of the page.</i></p>
	<p>2) Fold the paper in half again, in the same direction. It now forms a long bookmark shape.</p>
	<p>3) Fold the paper in half once more, this time in the other direction.</p>
	<p>4) Unfold your last two folds.</p>
	<p>5) Cut the centre of the fold to where the two fold lines meet.</p>

	<p>6) Open out the piece of paper. It will now be divided into 8 sections and will have a hole in the middle.</p>
	<p>7) Fold the paper in half again, this time lengthways. You now have a row of 4 sections on each side.</p>
	<p>8) Hold one end in each hand and push your hands together, until the cross section looks like the illustration.</p>
	<p>9) Find the cover of your mini story book and fold the pages in the right way.</p>
	<p>10) Your mini story book is finished!</p>
	<p>If you are making your own mini story book, please follow the page order and orientation as shown in the illustration.</p>
