

We are going to do a Bible study on the book of James. Before we start there are some important things we need to remember.




The Bible is inspired by God

Does that mean what we will learn about you should apply to your life?








Knowing the context helps us better understand what God is saying. Look out for this puzzle piece \sim



Week 2 James 1:2-8 Wisdom and Joy when troubles come

² Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles of **any kind** come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy. ³ For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow. ⁴ So let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing.

⁵ If you need wisdom, ask our generous God, and He will give it to you. He will not rebuke you for asking. ⁶But when you ask Him, be sure that your faith is in God alone. Do not waver, for a person with divided loyalty is as unsettled as a wave of the sea that is blown and tossed by the wind. ⁷ Such people should not expect to receive anything from the Lord. ⁸Their loyalty is divided between God and the world, and they are unstable in everything they do. 



Week 3 James 1:19-27 Hearing and doing the Word

¹⁹ Understand this, my dear brothers and sisters: You must all

be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to get angry.

²⁰ Human anger does not produce the righteousness God desires. ²¹ So get rid of all the filth and evil in your lives, and humbly accept the word God has planted in your hearts, for it has the power to save your souls. ²² But don't just listen to God's word. You must do what it says. Otherwise, you are only fooling yourselves. ²³ For if you listen to the word and don't obey, it is like glancing at your face in a mirror.²⁴ You see yourself, walk away, and forget what you look like. ²⁵ But if you look carefully into the **perfect law** that sets you free, and if you do what it says and don't forget what you heard, then God will bless you for doing it. ²⁶ If you claim to be religious but don't control your tongue, you are fooling yourself, and your religion is worthless. ²⁷ Pure and genuine religion in the sight of God the Father means caring for orphans and widows in their distress and refusing to let the world corrupt you.

The perfect or royal law that James mentions in verse 25 is talking about the Gospel message or the Good News. 



Week 4 James 2:14-26 Faith and good deeds

¹⁴ What good is it, dear brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but don't show it by your actions? Can that kind of faith save anyone? ¹⁵ Suppose you see a brother or sister who has no food or clothing,¹⁶ and you say, "Good-bye and have a good day; stay warm and eat well"—but then you don't give that person any food or clothing. What good does that do?

¹⁷ So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless.

¹⁸ Now someone may argue, "Some people have faith; others have good deeds." But I say, "How can you show me your faith if you don't have good deeds? I will show you my faith by my good deeds."

¹⁹ You say you have faith, for you believe that there is one God. Good for you! Even the demons believe this, and they tremble in terror. ²⁰ How foolish! Can't you see that faith without good deeds is useless?

²¹ Don't you remember that our ancestor Abraham was shown to be right with God by his actions when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? ²² You see, his faith and his actions worked together. His actions made his faith complete. ²³ And so it happened just as the Scriptures say: "Abraham believed God, and God counted him as righteous because of his faith." He was even called the friend of God. ²⁴ So you see, we are shown to be right with God by what we do, not by faith alone.

²⁵ Rahab the prostitute is another example. She was shown to be right with God by her actions when she hid those messengers and sent them safely away by a different road.
²⁶ Just as the body is dead without breath, so also faith is dead without good works.




It is important to know who James is talking to and what the conversation is about. If we read a sentence on its own it does not make sense.


James is <u>NOT</u> saying if you want to go to Heaven you need to do good deeds and earn your forgiveness. Forgiveness is a **gift from God** (Ephesians 2:8-9). When we believe and have faith in Jesus it is us accepting His gift.



James is talking to people who have already accepted this gift. They have faith. He is reminding these believers that God says we must 1000 Others like we 1000 Ourselves (James 2:8) and the way we can help save them from tough times is through the good deeds we do.




Week 5 James 3:1-12 The power of the tongue

Dear brothers and sisters, not many of you should become teachers in the church, for we who teach will be judged more strictly. ² Indeed, we all make many mistakes. For if we could control our tongues, we would be perfect and could also control ourselves in every other way.


³ We can make a **large** horse go wherever we want by means of a **small** bit in its mouth. ⁴ And a **small** rudder makes a **huge** ship turn wherever the pilot chooses to go, even though the winds are strong. ⁵ In the same way, the tongue is a **small** thing that makes **grand** speeches.

But a **tiny** spark can set a **great** forest on fire. ⁶ And among all the parts of the body, the tongue is a flame of fire. It is a whole world of wickedness, corrupting your entire body. It can set your whole life on fire, for it is set on fire by hell itself. ⁷ People can tame all kinds of animals, birds, reptiles, and fish, ⁸ but no one can tame the tongue. It is restless and evil, full of deadly poison.⁹ Sometimes it praises our Lord and Father, and sometimes it curses those who have been made in the image of God. ¹⁰ And so blessing and cursing come pouring out of the same mouth. Surely, my brothers and sisters, this is not right!¹¹ Does a spring of water bubble out with both fresh water and bitter water? ¹² Does a fig tree produce olives, or a grapevine produce figs? No, and you can't draw fresh water from a salty spring.







It is important to remember that our tongues have the power to lead any conversation we are in. Let's use them to show people how much we love Jesus and to bring them closer to loving Him too.



Week 6 James 3:13-18 Be wise and follow God's ways ¹³ If you are wise and understand God's ways, prove it by living an honourable life, doing good works with the humility that comes from wisdom. ¹⁴ But if you are bitterly jealous and there is selfish ambition in your heart, don't cover up the truth with boasting and lying. ¹⁵ For jealousy and selfishness are not God's kind of wisdom. Such things are earthly, unspiritual, and demonic. ¹⁶ For wherever there is jealousy and selfish ambition, there you will find disorder and evil of every kind. ¹⁷ But the wisdom from above is first of all <u>pure</u>. It is also peace loving, gentle at all times, and willing to yield to others. It is full of mercy and the fruit of good deeds. It shows no favouritism and is always sincere. ¹⁸ And those who are peacemakers will plant seeds of peace and reap

a harvest of righteousness.







Week 7 James 4:1-17 Worldliness vs Godliness ¹What is causing the quarrels and fights among you? Don't they come from the evil desires at war within you? ² You want what you don't have, so you scheme and kill to get it. You are **jealous** of what others have, but you can't get it, so you **fight** and wage war to take it away from them. Yet you don't have what you want because you don't ask God for it. ³ And even when you ask, you don't get it because your motives are all wrong—you want only what will give you pleasure. ⁴ You adulterers! Don't you realize that friendship with the world makes you an enemy of God? I say it again: If you want to be a friend of the world, you make yourself an enemy of God. ⁵ Do you think the Scriptures have no meaning? They say that God is passionate that the spirit He has placed within us should be faithful to Him. ⁶ And He gives grace generously. As the Scriptures say,

"God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

Week 8 James 5:7-11 Patience while we wait

⁷ Dear brothers and sisters, be **patient** as you wait for the Lord's return. Consider the farmers who **patiently** wait for the rains in the fall and in the spring. They eagerly look for the valuable harvest to ripen.⁸ You, too, must be patient. Take courage, for the coming of the Lord is near. ⁹ Don't grumble about each other, brothers and sisters, or you will be judged. For look—the Judge is standing at the door! ¹⁰ For examples of **patience** in suffering, dear brothers and sisters, look at the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.¹¹ We give great honour to those who endure under suffering. For instance, you know about Job, a man of great endurance. You can see how the Lord was kind to him at the end, for the Lord is full of tenderness and mercy.



"The Lord's return" and "The coming of the Lord" can be understood in two ways. 1) When Jesus comes back to earth

2) When God steps in and does things His way now.


